

Timor Leste is rugged with a mountainous backbone rising to over 2.000m (almost half of the land area has a slope of >40 degrees!). These mountains offer fine sceneries, while both the southern coastal flat lands and the northern rocky coasts offer silky white sand beaches with stunning views. Timor Leste offers excellent snorkelling and diving opportunities in its pristine waters. Tourism is nascent and, therefore, unspoiled: it is a hidden gem in the Far East.

- Christo Rei, a 27.0-metre-high colossal statue of Jesus Christ overseeing the bay towards Dili, the capital of Timor Leste.
- Atauro, an island north of Dili which has the highest diversity of reef fish and coral species of anywhere on earth. Perfect for diving and snorkeling.
- Tatamailau, enjoy stunning views after a climb to the highest peak of East Timor with an altitude of 2.963m.
